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## **GENERAL ADVISING TIPS**

- Typically, the higher the number, the harder the class.
- Plan FE courses so you have a good balance of content/workload.
- Registration clearance is required each semester, so meet your advisor and get cleared. Come with a plan.
- Registration times are assigned based on the number of units you have completed. Be prepared to register and come
  with back up options if certain courses are already full.
- Find a registration buddy who has had success with registration before. It's helpful in case you have any issues!
- Transfer Students: Verify you have completed ENG 1010 and MTH 1013 by Junior year.
- Identify and schedule courses that are limited by semester/year.
